## Code Of Conduct

Scouting is a values-based program with its own code of conduct. The Scout Oath and Law help instill the values of good conduct, respect for others, and honesty. Scouts learn skills that will last a lifetime, including basic outdoor skills, first aid, citizenship skills, leadership skills, and how to get along with others.

- 1) All Scouts are expected to live by the principles of the Scout Oath.
- 2) All Scouts are expected to live by the twelve points of the Scout Law.
- 3) All Scouts are expected to live by the principles of the Outdoor Code and Leave No Trace.
- 4) All Scouts are expected to abide by the regulations of the Youth Protection Training and the "A Time To Tell" program.
- 5) All Scouts are to refrain from the use of foul or demeaning language, acts, or gestures.
- 6) All Scouts are to refrain from the use of physical force upon another individual, which includes hitting, pushing, touching, spitting, tripping, throwing at, or to otherwise put someone in an threatening situation.
- 7) All Scouts are expected to control their temper and not engage in arguments, yelling, and tantrums.
- 8) All Scouts are to respect the possessions of the Troop, Patrols, Scouts, and others and not take, borrow, damage, or otherwise touch anything that does not belong to them, without permission.
- 9) All Scouts are to follow the trustworthy direction of the adult and youth Troop Leaders and remain with the Troop at all times while they are in the Troop's care.
- 10) All Scouts are to bring to the attention of an adult leader any situation that violates the Code Of Conduct and may not take matters into their own hands.

### Scout Law

*A Scout is ...  
trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly,  
courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful,  
thrifty, brave, clean, and reverent.*
